

GOODBYE!

As many of you know, the time has come to bid adieu to our original name. We start the new year off with a new identity. It hadn't been planned that way, but we started to make a few small changes to the by-laws and ended up restructuring the entire organization from top to bottom. So, Goodbye South Hills ARC, Goodbye N3SH Radio Club:

Hello Wireless Association of South Hills (WASH), soon to be Incorporated.

Many of you just did a double take. What happened to the previous new name, N3SH Radio Club?

Well, on November 19, 1998, the FCC database suddenly showed that N3SH was no longer held by W3SRL as trustee for the South Hills ARC, but by N3WX as trustee for the South Hills ARC Inc. Person or persons as yet unknown filed a false Form 610B with the FCC, falsely claiming the two organizations were one & the same, and falsely claiming to be officer(s) of SHARC. A complaint was immediately filed with the FCC by then-SHARC President W3RJM & trustee W3SRL. The matter is currently being investigated by the FCC. Since it's under investigation, we can't comment further (though we hope that it is resolved soon!).

But... we can't very well be the N3SH RC when we don't hold N3SH, no matter the circumstance. It would make us look even more foolish, especially if we never see the call again.

So, we went with the name that had the next highest number of votes. At our brief business meetings, before and after the Christmas party, on December 10, all present voted unanimously (twice) for the new name.

Long live the Wireless Association of South Hills!


Let's have a blast together in 1999!
