

5th Annual WASH 2M Contest!

This January will mark the Fifth Annual **WASH** 2 Meter Contest. We've already had a lot of interest in it, and this year promises to be even more exciting!

Remember: In response to input from our participants, and in view of the growing popularity of radios like the Ten-Tec 6N2, IC-706 & FT-100, the contest will NOT only be an FM contest but also open to SSB, and CW! (Digital? Maybe next year!)

Everyone who participated in it the last four years had a blast, and we hope to continue the tradition again this year!

There may be some additional "tweaking" of the rules between now and January, so keep an eye on this column in the next few newsletters, and we'll look forward to seeing you on the 8^{th} !

Date & Times: Saturday, January 8th, 2005 from 7 to 11 PM EST. (That's January 9th 0000-0400 UTC to the purists!)

Objectives:

- To make as many contacts as possible
- To have fun!

Band, Mode & Frequencies: The contest will take place solely on 2 meter band

FM: FM simplex only, no repeater contacts. The FM frequencies are all standard 2 Meter simplex frequencies, as per the ARRL 2 Meter Band Plan, every 15 kHz, from 146.535 to 146.595 MHz, and 147.405 to 147.585 MHz. The National Simplex Frequency, 146.520, and simplex frequencies below that are not to be used.

Special Note On Band Plans: According to the WPRC Frequency Coordinator, the Western PA Repeater Council has issued their own 2 Meter band plan that differs from the ARRL plan. According to the WPRC plan, many FM Simplex channels under the ARRL plan have been "withdrawn" and been reserved or re-assigned as repeater inputs and/or outputs. It is not known how many of the frequencies have actually been coordinated for actual working repeaters. Considering that the ARRL band plan has been in existence for over 25 years, that the WPRC band plan is of much more recent vintage, and that the WPRC band plan is virtually unknown outside of the WPRC, we are using the ARRL plan as our "standard." However, contest participants are reminded that under good amateur practice, they should try and avoid interference with actual operating repeaters using these frequencies. Therefore, contest participants are requested to refrain from using "standard" simplex frequencies that are known to be repeater inputs and/or outputs in their geographical area.

CW: 144.05 to 144.1 MHz Only. (See ARRL 2 Meter band plan) **SSB**: 144.2 to 144.275 MHz Only. (See ARRL 2 Meter band plan)

In the event of accidental QRM with nets and non-contest QSO's in progress, please respect their right to the frequency and QSY.

Power Limit: Maximum 50 watts output. No external amplifiers.

Exchange : Callsign, contact number, ZIP Code, and whether or not you are a Member of WASH or a Club Station. For the purposes of the contest, the 5 Digit ZIP Code for your location is sufficient — do not use the "Zip +4" code. Mobiles and portables should use the ZIP code of their location as determined to the best of their ability. Canadian stations will use their 6 digit postal code.

Example 1: "N3ZCG from N3ZEL, please copy Number 3, 15347, Member." Example 2: "K3VX from K3CM, please copy Number 21, 16801, Non-Member" Example 3: "W3WH from W3OC, please copy Number 7, 15137, Club Station"

- **Contacts**: Work as many different calls and locations as possible, giving Exchange as noted above. Work each station **once** per mode, and **once** per ZIP Code — Mobiles can be reworked whenever they c hange locations. Remember hilltops work best!
- **Disqualification**: Remember, this is a friendly "for fun" contest. Stations may be disqualified for infractions of the rules and for unacceptable operating practices. While not an inclusive list, stations may be disqualified for:
- FM signals transmitted on simplex channels 146.52 MHz and below .
- Intentional interference to non-contes ters, established nets, and QSO's
- Intentional interference to other contest operators
- The contest committee reserves the right to verify QSO's. QSO's that can
 not be verified may be removed from the log without penalty, especially if the
 committee is unable to obtain log information for verification.

A Sweepstakes Lesson

I have just returned from a whirlwind weekend in Myrtle Beach, SC and am sitting back reflecting all that has transpired in the last two days. It was education, vacation, frustration, elation, and exhaustion; all at the same time!

First, the Myth: I've always had this idea that contesting (or operating in general) is best when I am on the receiving end of a run where stations are falling over themselves to work ME! I hope I'm not the only one! Anyway, since I don't have wheelbarrows full of money to spend on joining an exotic dxpedition, I thought (and now here's the myth) that all one had to do is travel to a "rare" sweepstakes location here is the good old USA and that would satisfy the appetite for that elusive pileup. After all, how many times have I been one of those mediocre signals in a pile seeking Northern Territories, Idaho, North Dakota, or Rhode Island for that final section in Sweepstakes?

The Twisted Logic: I did some research and looked at past results from Sweepstakes in years gone by. Twenty -Eight logs were submitted last year from North Carolina contesters. Seventy-three had participated from Virginia. There were only seven from Delaware, the state with the fewest hams. Then I checked South Carolina. Seven. Huh? Only seven? I guess there aren't many contesters in the state to our south. I have always had trouble getting SC section in the past; maybe my pileup was there?

Darn the Torpedoes, Full Speed Ahead: OK, we're going to South Carolina for Sweepstakes Phone. Where can I get an antenna high in the air and be fairly comfortable (I didn't want to operate from a picnic table in a public park, hi!) I thought putting a small antenna on the balcony of a top floor room in high rise hotel. Combine that with the ocean, just the ticket! Myrtle Beach is that kind of place, and the XYL won't object to going there! Perfect plan. After all, height is the most important aspect in an antenna and even a small compromise antenna would be awesome on the 18th floor! Not!

The Reality: I knew the antenna had to be small. A lot of good things have been said about the W3FF Buddipole, so I built one and tested it. I acquired a Hamstick for 75 along the way and all was set. Both are good all purpose antennas, and I got good reports from casually operating with them. But they are severely compromised in the efficiency department simply because their small size. This didn't matter, I thought, after all height and location (See Twisted Logic above) was the great equalizer! The result? I had a signal that was strong enough to successfully interfere with my competition and make the station I was calling ask for a repeat of the other guy. I could not sustain a run for any length of time because shifting propagation caused QRM to "bump" me. I received strong stations that sometimes simply didn't answer me even with no one else calling them. Each and every QSO (with some exceptions) was an exercise of great effort. Long CQ's went with no answer. When I finely would work one, they would say, gratefully, "Thanks for SC, needed that one last year, you're my third one, glad to see you guys out this year." Urrrrgh! That was just great! I was getting the revelation on my Twisted Logic. To add insult to injury, I too needed SC section for my score. I found one who was running a big pileup, massive pileup, MY PILEUP, a pileup I was never able to break into. I missed only 9 sections, SC was one of them.

The Glass is Half Full: The Poindexter Hotel was right on the ocean and had some good quality time with my XYL at sunrise when there were no signals on any band. She was a real trooper, taking care of my creature comforts and pretending not to be disappointed at getting a room with the balcony facing the street (west) and not one facing the ocean. She also said it was no problem getting the \$45 room, as the \$117 room was much more than we needed. Almost every one of the 425 guys (and a few gals) I worked expressed gladness, relief and great appreciation for working SC. Some, you could just tell in their voice, others expressed it to me, and a few were even beside themselves with joy. It was fun being on the receiving end of all that. I had two brief runs (less than an hour) on 15 meters; I may have been spotted once. I'm guessing the multiplier hunters from the big stations were working the other SC stations I mentioned. Bottom line, I got 60,064 points, 71 sections, and worked the entire allotted 24 hours (out of 30). If there were sweep credits for receiving, I had a "receive" sweep, just couldn't break the piles for a Q.

Post Mortem: I've had a better score working casually from home in North Carolina where NC Q's are a dime a dozen. What I have learned from this experience is that contests are brutal. Compromise antennas that, under ordinary circumstances, are entirely satisfactory don't bode well in contests. No height or seemingly "rare" location will make up for this deficiency. And the lower the frequency, the worst this is. If ten meters had been open, maybe I would have had a different result. The semi-rare stations running good

DX News Briefs

For over 10 years, the authorities in India have prevented any Amateur Radio operation from the **VU4 Andaman Islands** allegedly for security reasons. In mid November, word came out that VU2RBI, who was involved with one of the last DXpeditions to the islands, was seeking

As of deadline, no CW operation had taken place; any alleged CW operations are those of Slim. CW operation may take place later, when K4VUD plans to join the operation, if he is permitted. FCC News

ARRL Web Extra & ARRL Letter, courtesy American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, November 16th, 2004 — FCC Special Counsel for Enforcement Riley Hollingsworth has reminded a New Jersey radio amateur that all frequencies in the Amateur Service are shared. Hollingsworth included the advice in a Warning Notice to Irwin L. Richardt, W2VJZ, in response to complaints from other 75-meter AM operators.

Hollingsworth in July asked Richardt, an Advanced class licensee, to respond to a complaint alleging, among other things, that Richardt would not relinquish the "AM window" (3885 kHz) or let others use the frequency unless he was included in the conversation. Richardt promptly responded, charging that the c omplaint was "yet another of



those many attempts over the years to stop me from freely speaking on my radio station about Jesus, Jefferson and Jersey." Hollingsworth called the response "unacceptable."

"We have reviewed your response as well as tape recordings submitted with the complaint," Hollingsworth said in the October 22 Warning Notice. He told Richardt that it was "absolutely irrelevant" under the Amateur Service rules how long he had been licensed or how many hours a day he spent monitoring or using the frequency.

"None of that makes a frequency 'your frequency," Hollingsworth said, "and contrary to your belief, anyone you perceive as a 'newcomer' to the frequency-or indeed even a 'newcomer' to Amateur Radio--has the same rights to that frequency as yourself."

The primary complainant has alleged that Richardt exhibits "eccentric" and "offensive" behavior on the air, occasionally leaving his AM transmitter keyed while he does other tasks around his house. Another radio amateur, a member of the FCC Technological Advisory Council, said W2VJZ continues to attempt to contact him even though he's made it clear he does n't wish to speak with Richardt.

Referring to his ham station as "my electronic printing press," Richardt asserted in his July 28 response to the FCC that he's been "a victim of vicious radio jamming for well over one quarter of a century." He also claimed to have once discovered a "jamming transmitter" hidden in nearby woods "to prevent me from freely speaking." In addition, Richardt accused another station of transmitting "filthy lies and language" when he was in QSO with his friends in July.

Hollingsworth said if incidents "such as those outlined in the complaint" recur, the FCC will initiate enforcement actions that could include fines, license revocation or both.

pileups (MS, WY, ND, MB) all had BOOMING signals. Twice, when I worked a Q I got the comment, "nice signal" how did that happen? Most of the time I would get beat out by a station, then, as I was listening waiting my turn, the running station would tell that caller, "please repeat all, I can barely copy you!?!" Sheesh, was my signal that weak? Running stations had good signals, period. Signal and technique were really the most important aspects of success; location was only a minor enhancement in contesting, not the great equalizer I had hoped. I have a new respect to the QRP contesters, it must take a lot of patience. That is what I learned.
