# **PA Tower Legislation**

The time has come to be considerably more serious than we have been over the antenna tower legislation that is pending in the Pennsylvania Legislature. At the present time both House Bill 1777 (HB1777) and Senate Bill (SB884) are presently lying idle in their respective committees. Some of the information that we have been given indicates that progress on this legislation is stalled because of political party considerations. We CANNOT CONFIRM NOR DENY this information. The Fact remains that the legislation is apparently at an impasse. We need to get this legislation moving before it dies in Committee.

What I propose is that everyone contact the members of the involved committees (see information below) and urge them to approve this proposed legislation and get it out onto the floor of the General Assembly for a vote. Senators and Representatives who are also sponsors of the bills are identified below. Members of the committee who are also sponsors should be sent a communication thanking them for their support in sponsoring the legislation and asking their continued support. Once the legislation has been approved by the Senate and House Committees (Local Government Committee) we will then make contact with or Senators and Representatives in the General Assembly and urge their support of the legislation.

# **Council Delays Action on Ham Antennas**

Grand Terrace, CA, March 12th, 2008 — Ham- radio operators itching to erect towering antennas on their properties will need to hold off until guidelines have been set by the city.

Efforts to adopt an ordinance that would require the operators to get a building permit from the city before installing antennas were set aside at Tuesday night's City Council meeting. Gary Koontz, the city's community development director, said the council decided to form a committee to allow city officials to meet with the operators and get input on a course of action. City staff will provide an update in two weeks to the council on the status of the committee and planned meetings, Koontz said.

The proposed ordinance would restrict the height of antennas to no more than 20 feet with no more than one additional whip antenna. Property owners within a 300-foot radius from where an antenna is proposed would have to be notified in advance.

The issue was brought to the forefront about three years ago, when Lark Street resident Hans Ehlert put up a 35-foot antenna on his property. Riled-up neighbors complained to the city. Some residents have since moved, because they thought the antenna was such a blight on the neighborhood.

The city ordered Ehlert to take the antenna down or get a permit. Ehlert applied for a permit for a 75-foot antenna. He said the taller antenna would enhance his ability to communicate with other ham-radio operators throughout the world.

In response, the city placed a moratorium on the approval of any new applications for amateur ham-radio antennas until an ordinance could be drafted and adopted for such purposes. Neither Ehlert nor attorney Leonard Shaffer, a volunteer attorney with the American Radio Relay League, could not be reached for comment.



In buying and selling ham radio gear over the internet for nearly 10 years, I finally got burnt on a deal on QRZ. The person represented himself as a ham stealing the call and name, answered technical questions correctly, and had a PayPal® account.

I send this email as a reminder to hams that frauds can happen.

If I ever purchase equipment again I will at the least:

- 1 Verify that the name and call is correct
- 2. Contact the person via phone, verify phone number and reverse look up address.
- 3. Check the IP address of the purchaser to determine if it lines up with the address from the ham call.
- 4. Paypal sellers will have to have Buyer protection.
- 5. Limit purchases to people that have a known history (like on this list) or Buyer feedback.
- 6. Encourage face to face exchanges for local deals.

The worst thing to do is see a great deal and rush to get it, while dropping all the normal verifications you might go through.

Live and learn.

## KH4 Reopens to Visitors!

Midway Atoll National Wildlife Refuge, US Fish & Wildlife Service

Honolulu, HI, January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2008 — After a six year hiatus, Midway Atoll is being reopened to week-long excursions. Imagine yourself on a tiny island in the midst of the Pacific, surrounded by a million nesting seabirds and the remnants of a battle that changed the course of World War II, and within the largest marine conservation area in the world.



These longer visits will allow people to fully experience the wildlife spectacle and historic significance that make Midway so unique."

"Midway is a living laboratory,; it's unique ecosystems are under constant study. Similar to the Galapagos Islands, Midway offers an unparalleled wildlife experience where birds and fish have little fear of people, allowing close observation," said Birgit Winning, Oceanic Society's Executive Director. "In addition to seeing thousands of albatross, visitors can observe the endangered Hawaiian Monk Seal, green sea turtles, and spinner dolphins, as well as snorkel in pristine waters. Visitors will learn about the wildlife and history of the islands and have a chance to participate in restoration efforts during their stay. We appreciate the opportunity to return to Midway and working with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service staff to introduce visitors to this unique wildlife haven of such historical significance."

Oceanic Society will coordinate seven week-long trips to Midway Atoll in 2008 to foster public awareness of the importance and sensitivity of remote atoll ecosystems. Numerous provisions of the permit ensure the protection of Midway's wildlife and historic resources while allowing visitors to learn about and experience this unique ecosystem. The guided tours will interpret both the biological and historical importance of Midway and Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument, and visitors will also learn of the cultural significance of the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands for Native Hawaiians. # FCC Approves New Broadband Mapping Plan Grant Gross, IDG News Service

Responding to long-time criticisms about its broadband measurements, the U. S. Federal Communications Commission on Wednesday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, voted to approve a broadband mapping plan that would break down broadband availability by speed across the country and provide a more granular look at where broadband is available.

The plan that could help the agency pinpoint problems with broadband availability and give it a better idea where speeds are lacking.

The FCC says that more than 99 percent of the U.S. postal Zip Codes have at least one broadband provider. But critics have said the FCC's data is flawed because it counts a Zip Code as covered by broadband if one address in the Zip Code has service available, and the agency has counted anything above 200K bps (bits per second) as broadband.

The new plan would measure broadband availability by Census tract, a geographic area that's typically significantly smaller than a Zip Code. And the agency will break out five speed tiers in its upcoming broadband reports, the lowest tier being 200K bps to 768K bps and the fastest tier more than 6M bps.

#### An Opposing Point of View

Public Knowledge, an advocacy group focused on digital rights, gave the FCC a "mixed review" on its broadband actions Wednesday. In addition to the new broadband mapping plan, the FCC issued a report saying broadband deployment was proceeding in a "reasonable and timely" manner.

"The commission today presented a mixed message to the public," said Gigi Sohn, Public Knowledge's president and co-founder. "It is a mystery why the commission chose to issue this report when, mere moments later, the commission admitted the inadequacy of the information by starting the process to update the data collection on broadband."

While the FCC should be commended for "recognizing the need to change long-outdated definition of broadband it had been using," it should have also separated residential data from commercial data, Sohn said. The FCC also failed to address broadband pricing data measurement for now, she said.

FCC Chairman Kevin Martin noted that high-speed lines in the U.S. increased by 22 percent to 100 million lines in the first half of 2007. While broadband deployment is proceeding, "there is certainly more work to be done," Martin said. "This improved data will enable us to better identify and analyze the deployment of broadband throughout the nation."

But Commissioner Michael Copps noted that broadband customers in many other nations have speeds of 25M bps to 100M bps for less money per month than U.S. customers pay for less than 10M bps.

"The fact is that your country and mine has never had any cognizable national broadband strategy to get the job done," Copps said. "We've been working with one hand tied behind our backs, inhibited by the commission's dependence on antiquated methodologies and less than rigorous analysis. I'm happy we're starting to change our benchmarks, but, my goodness, how late it is."

About 54 percent of U.S. broadband customers had cable modem service as of June 30<sup>th</sup>, according to the FCC statistics released Wednesday. About 34 percent had DSL (Digital subscriber lines), and about 2 percent had fiber lines. Other technologies accounted for the remainder
