

Royden R. Freeland Sr. founded International Crystal in 1950, at first operating out of his garage. One of his first contracts was to produce crystals for Collins Radio. The elder Freeland and his wife died in a 1978 air crash, and his son took over the company, which expanded into the production of other electronics in the 1980s.

In the 1990s, though, it sold off some of its equipment and distribution business to concentrate on its core enterprise — the manufacture of crystal and oscillator products.

The announcement caught some manufacturers off guard, and they are seeking to source the products they had been buying from ICM, one of the few remaining US-based manufacturer of crystal products. Radio amateurs requiring crystals for projects or as replacement parts for older equipment also will have to look elsewhere.

Ironically, International boasts on its website that it's "a proud supplier to RadioShack," which, for the second time in 2 years, declared Chapter 11 bankruptcy this week.

You've Got Questions? We've Got Chapter 11! RadioShack Files For Bankruptcy — Again American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT. March 9th, 2017 — Once the go-to store for radio amateurs, electronics tinkerers, and shortwave listeners, RadioShack has filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy for the second time in 2 years, placing the future of its remaining stores in jeopardy. The 1743 retail outlets that survived RadioShack's 2015 bankruptcy were acquired by General Wireless Inc, an affiliate of Standard General LP, which, at the time, received US Bankruptcy Court approval to acquire the inventory and assume the leases of the RadioShack stores. Now down to 1,500 stores, RadioShack once boasted more than 5,000 stores nationwide. At least some of RadioShack's 5,900 employees could be affected. That figure is down from 7,500 workers 2 years ago.

"RadioShack.com, stores and dealer locations across the country are still currently open for business and serving customers," the company said in a news release. "The Company is closing approximately 200 stores and evaluating options on the remaining 1,300. The Company and its advisors are currently exploring all available strategic alternatives to maximize value for creditors, including the possibility of keeping stores open on an ongoing basis."



The acquisition by General Wireless followed a bankruptcy auction in 2015. Plans at the time called for "co-branding" about 1440 of the surviving stores with cellular phone provider Sprint Corp. RadioShack also has closed more stores and slashed operating expenses by more than 20%, but it wasn't enough. CEO Dene Rogers cited weak mobile phone sales as a factor. Chapter 11 gives RadioShack another opportunity to restructure and stay in business. The retailer joins other brick-and-mortar stores forced to shutter outlets in the face of declining sales and fiscal losses, and electronics stores have been especially hard hit.

Dating its founding to 1921, RadioShack once offered a considerable array of name-brand Amateur Radio equipment — even beams and towers — along with home entertainment gear and discrete components — including transistors, resistors, and capacitors. Its iconic 1960s-era catalog ran to more than 300 pages. In later years, it sold a fairly popular 2 meter handheld transceiver for a time, as well as Citizens Band equipment, 10-meter single-banders, and shortwave receivers. RadioShack's website is announcing a clearance sale, with some items steeply discounted.

"RadioShack did more to spread the early technology culture in the US than any other commercial institution," ARRL CEO Tom Gallagher NY2RF, observed. "Its catalog was the Boys' Life of electronics.'

A Most Unique Collins Radio Company Part Number

Richardson, TX, March 8th, 2017 — A few weeks ago, I finally had the electrical service, and the breaker panel, in my house updated. The breaker box is located in my darkroom (which has not been used to develop any film or photographs for some time). The room is now used, primarily, for storing things and I had to clean out some of the things to allow the replacement of the breaker box. Then, 2-days ago, I did some more cleaning and came across the "Earthrise" photographs:



Although the photograph has nothing really to do with Collins radios, my print has an actual Collins Radio Company part number assigned! In fact, the print was made from the original negative at the Photo Lab located in building 402 at the Richardson, Texas, "new" corporate headquarters (Dallas Region).

The story behind the photograph, and its having an official Collins part number, may be interesting to some. In early 1969, Art Collins somehow got NASA to loan several of the original negatives of the photographs taken by William Anders on the Apollo 8 mission, 24 December 1968.

At the time, my job, at Collins Radio Company, was as the liaison between the engineering departments and the production departments in Process Division. The Photo Lab was part of Process Division. Art had sent the negatives over to the Photo Lab to have personal copies of the photographs developed. Process Division was unique in that it had 2-Division Directors, one was "over" the engineering and production departments and one was "over" the administrative departments. One of the Directors, I don't remember which one although it was probably the administrative director since I was the 2nd level below him, found out about the negative and instructed me to have 16-inch by 20-inch copies made for the Division Vice President, both directors, and certain department managers. The director also told me that I could have a copy if I wanted it (I probably would have had one made, for myself, any way).

Art had decreed that the existence of the negatives, and the prints made from those negatives, remain a secret. Each print was put in a cardboard mailing tube and the tubes were delivered to my office for distribution. I was instructed to take each person, on the distribution list, a single print and make sure that this person was the only one to handle the mailing tube, not even the secretary of the department was to handle the mailing tube!

About a week later, the negatives were returned to NASA.

Although I was hired, right out of college for the liaison job, I had a lot of privileges and was privy to a lot of information that was not, generally, available to the vast number of employees. That was a double edged sword and I often knew, several months in advance, when a particular project was to cease and the engineers / technicians, on that project, were to be laid off and yet I could not even give those persons the slightest hint!

I was also in a position where I knew that Collins Radio Company was in trouble financially even though I got a raise every 6-months. A week after getting 2-raises at the same time, another, local, company offered me a 50% increase in salary on top of what I was now making at Collins Radio. It was a "no brainer" and I took the offer. Then, 2-weeks later, my secretary came over to the new company.

There are always some kinks to work out — we have to finagle a way to get the talk-in station antenna outside the building, the directions will need a little tweaking, that sort of thing — but overall, it looks like this move is permanent. One big advantage, for our vendors at least, is that we have access to the Home Economics Building for the entire weekend, so we can permit vendors to come in on Saturday to set up, or at least (for those travelling a long way) drop things off to go get some rest. In any event, let our hamfest committee know your concerns or your kudos!

So how'd we do overall? As of the March meeting, Mark N3RDV didn't have all receipts, bills, and other miscellaneous after-hamfest paperwork in or completed, so we don't know the exact figures yet. We hope to have those by April's meeting. In general, though... we again had a sell out on vendor tables prior to Sunday. As in the past, we will be providing support to marathon medical staff. In keeping with the purpose of the Amateur Radio service, our main task is to provide emergency communications between the medical director and the various aid stations and other locations along the course, in the event regular communications channels fail. We also provide increased reliability for the most critical information and provide communications support to various medical officials. In order to accomplish this, we will staff many positions, including aid stations, mile markers, shadows for medical officials, and others. To fully cover all of these positions, we will need around 100 volunteer amateur radio operators, including you!

If you're new to the hobby or have never participated in a public service event, please don't let that stop you from joining us. We have a variety of positions for new and experienced hams alike, and will provide you with the information and support you need. This is an excellent opportunity to gain the experience needed to help out during an emergency, all while having fun and doing a service to our community.

Volunteering online is quick and easy, using the marathon's official volunteer registation system. We are using a first-come, first-served system in which you can select your position when signing up. So, be sure to select the job you want when submitting your registration. If you're not sure where you want to be, that's OK; just select "General Locations", and we'll find a place for you. Once you are registered, your assignment and detailed instructions will arrive in the mail in April, 2017. Note that we will **not** be holding a meeting the day before the race; details on how to obtain your T-shirt and marathon credential will be contained in your assignment packet.







