



NASA's New Al Model Can Issue Solar Storm Warnings 30 Minutes Before They Strike

West Bengal, India, May 16th, 2023 – In the modern day, there are few things as scary as losing your internet connection without warning. Whether you're struggling to meet work deadlines or waiting for your crush's reply after sending a particularly risky text, a sudden blackout can be daunting.

And with the Sun being especially active these days and throwing volatile solar flares and coronal mass ejections (CMEs) our way, sparking geomagnetic storms on Earth, we could be in for many such blackouts.

However, NASA, with its penchant for coming to the rescue, has devised a new computer model that combines artificial intelligence and NASA satellite data to alert us of turbulent space weather.

The model uses AI to analyse spacecraft measurements of the solar wind (an unrelenting stream of material from the Sun) and predict where an impending solar storm will strike, anywhere on Earth, with 30 minutes of warning!

This could provide us with just enough time to prepare for these storms and prevent severe impacts on power grids and other critical infrastructure.

How does space weather impact Earth?

In the past year, we did witness a marked rise in the Sun's activity. And this prominent display of its ire can be attributed to the fact that we are inching closer to the peak of its solar cycle — an 11-year period during which the Sun's magnetic field does a 180 flip, causing its north and south poles to switch places.

As the Sun shoots out sparks and solar winds, solar material sometimes strikes Earth's magnetic environment (its "magnetosphere"),

Congresswoman Lesko Reintroduces Bill to Replace Symbol Rate Limit with Bandwidth Limit

Newington, CT, May 12th, 2023 – Congresswoman Debbie Lesko (AZ-08) introduced *The Amateur Radio Communications Improvement Act* (H.R. 3241) on May 11th, 2023, to require that the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) eliminate the obsolete HF digital symbol rate limit with a 2.8 kHz bandwidth limit.

After being petitioned by ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® in 2013 (RM-11708) for the same relief, in 2016 the Commission issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (WT Docket No. 16-239) in which it agreed that the HF symbol rate limit was outmoded, served no purpose, and hampered experimentation. But the Commission questioned whether any bandwidth limit was needed in its place. Most amateurs, including the ARRL, objected to there being no signal bandwidth limit in the crowded HF bands given the possibility that unreasonably wide bandwidth digital protocols could be developed. Since 2016 there has been no further FCC action.

Congresswoman Lesko introduced a similar bill (H.R. 9664) in the 117th Congress in 2022. Read ARRL's coverage of that bill at this link. Lesko has long demonstrated an interest in supporting Amateur Radio. Earlier in 2023, she spoke at a Hamfest in Phoenix, Arizona where she met with and praised the work of ARRL Volunteers in the state.

e FCC to place limits on symbol

"Increased amounts of data can be put on the spectrum due to advances in modern technology, so there is little need for the FCC to place limits on symbol rates," said Congresswoman Lesko. "That is why I am proud to reintroduce this important legislation to update the FCC's rules and increase the speed of transmission so that amateur radio operators can more efficiently and effectively transmit messages during times of crisis, such as natural disasters."

ARRL President Rick Roderick K5UR hailed reintroduction of the bill, stating that "the biggest effects of the FCC's delay in removing this outdated restriction have been to require totally inefficient spectrum use on the already-crowded amateur HF bands and to remove incentives for American amateurs to innovate with new and better digital protocols. It also has necessitated multiple requests for waivers by the ARRL to facilitate communications during disasters, especially during hurricane season when corresponding amateur stations in the Caribbean, some of which have received assistance from the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) for disaster communications, use faster protocols than currently allowed in the U.S. I hope that the Commission will act to remove this harmful limitation without waiting for the bill to be passed."

ARRL Legislative Advocacy Committee Chairman John Robert Stratton N5AUS added that "the symbol rate limit hampers experimentation and development of more efficient HF data protocols by U.S. amateurs. For all practical purposes the field has been ceded to amateurs outside the U.S., where there is no comparable limit. Removing the restriction not only will allow U.S. amateurs to use the most efficient data protocol suitable for their purpose, but it also will promote and incentivize U.S. amateurs to experiment with and develop even more efficient protocols."

ARRL extends its deepest appreciation to Congresswoman Debbie Lesko for her continued leadership on behalf of Amateur Radio licensees, and her supportive actions on communications issues that impact her constituents and the nation," said The American Radio Relay League's (ARRL) Legislative Committee. "The introduction of the *Amateur Radio Communications Improvement Act* by Congresswoman Lesko to remove the long-outdated symbol rate limit restricting the speed of amateur digital transmissions will substantially increase the ability of amateur radio to provide more timely and efficient message handling during natural disasters such as hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, and forest fires. Congresswoman Lesko's foresight in introducing this legislation will serve as a model for the elimination of regulatory barriers to more intensive spectrum sharing."

ARRL and FEMA Sign Agreement

Amateur Radio is as Relevant as Ever

Newington, CT, May 26th, 2023 – The agreement emphasizes the importance of skilled Amateur Radio Operators in times of crisis and the role of ARES leadership within the emergency communications space.

ARES (see the ARES fact sheet at, www.arrl.org/ares) is a network of trained Amateur Radio Service licensees organized across the country to provide communications and other support to served agencies, such as local governments, hospitals, and disaster response charities.

More than 20,000 ARES volunteers actively participate in the ARRL program. In 2022, they provided more than 420,000 labor hours of service saving local officials \$13.4 million in personnel costs.

Each member of ARES has specialized training in emergency communications. Many have also completed training in the National Incident Management System (NIMS) in order to integrate with local officials during an emergency response.

In March 2023, FEMA released the final version of the NIMS Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Functional Guidance, which includes radio amateurs in the response ecosystem and national emergency preparedness.

"The agreement is representative of the continued commitment and cooperation between FEMA and ARRL," said ARRL Director of Emergency Management Josh Johnston KE5MHV. "Serving our country during emergencies is an important service provided by ARES volunteers and a principal purpose of our Amateur Radio Service. Our well-equipped volunteers bring their training, use of innovative technologies, and community partnerships together to serve before and during disasters."

FEMA announced the new agreement on Twitter stating, "We recently signed a new MOA with ARRL -- establishing our partnership with licensed, voluntary amateur radio operators to support response (and) recovery efforts. We're honored to work side-by-side to meet the needs of millions in the wake of disasters."

Former FEMA Administrator and ARRL member Craig Fugate KK4INZ, led the agency when the previous MOA with ARRL was signed in 2014. Fugate said the agreement underscores the importance of ham radio. "By incorporating amateur radio into their emergency plans, FEMA ensures that they have access to a network of trained operators who can establish and maintain communication links when traditional infrastructure fails. This collaboration between FEMA and Amateur Radio Operators allows for more robust and resilient emergency communication capabilities, ultimately contributing to effective disaster response and recovery," said Fugate.

"The ARRL Board and the Emergency Communications and Field Services Committee are committed to strengthening our resourcefulness to the EmComm (emergency communications) community," said ARRL President Rick Roderick K5UR. "Our partnership with FEMA helps further ARRL's work to better serve our volunteers, partner agencies, and the country."

creating geomagnetic storms. The impacts of these magnetic storms can range from mild to extreme, but in a world increasingly dependent on technology, their effects are growing ever more disruptive.

NASA cites the example of the destructive solar storm that caused electrical blackouts across Quebec for 12 hours in 1989, plunging millions of Canadians into the dark and closing schools and businesses.

Another great example of such an event is the 1859 Carrington Event. The most intense solar storm on record, it sparked fires at telegraph stations and prevented messages from being sent. Had the Carrington Event happened today, it would have even more severe impacts, like widespread electrical disruptions, persistent blackouts, and interruptions to global communications. Such technological chaos could cripple economies and endanger the safety and livelihoods of people worldwide.

How NASA's Al model will help with solar storm prediction

NASA's new computer model, DAGGER (Deep Learning Geomagnetic Perturbation), has been using AI to look for connections between the solar wind and geomagnetic disruptions or perturbations that wreak havoc on our

The researchers used an AI method called 'deep learning', which can train computers to recognise patterns based on previous examples. And the team of researchers used the technology to identify these patterns between solar wind measurements from solar missions.

These heliophysics missions consist of space probes carefully placed to create a vast array of sensors so they can work together to study the Sun.

The team tested DAGGER against two geomagnetic storms in August 2011 and March 2015. And the system was able to quickly and accurately forecast the storm's impacts worldwide in each case.

"With this AI, it is now possible to make rapid and accurate global predictions and inform decisions in the event of a solar storm, thereby minimising - or even preventing – devastation to modern society," said lead author Vishal Upendran of the Inter-University Center for Astronomy and Astrophysics in India.

FCC News

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, May 25^{th} , 2023 – President Joe Biden announced three nominees for the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) on May 22^{nd} 2023. The President will nominate Anna M. Gomez for a vacant FCC seat. Two sitting Commissioners, Geoffrey Starks and Brendan Carr, will be nominated for new terms at the same time.

Gomez is an attorney with decades of experience in domestic and international communications law and policy. Gomez currently serves as a Senior Advisor for International Information and Communications Policy in the State Department's Bureau of Cyberspace and Digital Policy, where she has been leading US preparations for the monthlong WRC-23 conference that will commence on November 20th in Dubai. ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® has represented the interests of US radio amateurs in preparation for the conference, and ARRL Technical Relations Specialist Jon Siverling WB3ERA, has been appointed to the US delegation to WRC-23. ARRL also actively supports the work of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU), which, as a member of the ITU Radiocommunication Sector, participates in conference preparatory work and whose representatives will also attend WRC-23 by invitation as observers in an advisory capacity.

Earlier in her career, Gomez served for 12 years in various positions at the FCC, including Deputy Chief of the International Bureau and Senior Legal Advisor to then-Chairman William E. Kennard. From 2009 to 2013, she served as the National Telecommunications and Information Administration Deputy Administrator. Gomez also briefly served as Counsel on the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation Subcommittee on Communications, as well as Deputy Chief of Staff of the National Economic Council during the Clinton Administration. Prior to joining the State Department in 2023, Gomez was a partner in the Washington, D.C. law firm Wiley LLP. Gomez also was Vice President for Federal and State Government Affairs at Sprint Nextel and an Associate at the Arnold & Porter law firm.

Senate hearings on all three nominees are expected to be held in June.


