# A Few Tense Moments, and Basic Troubleshooting

Burley, WA, June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023 – I was happily tuning the bands, working stations on SSB and FT8 over the course of the morning - the new SteppIR DB18E working its magic - along with the FTDX-101MP and the Elecraft KPA1500... when all of the sudden, BAM the amp went into full "RED LIGHTS SWR SHUTDOWN" mode.

Oh no! My first thought was I'd somehow blown up the guts of the SteppIR or the amp was failing.

I tentatively tried other bands but with the amp in standby - SAME RESULT - I'd get to maybe 3 watts and the KPA1500 SWR lights would go red and shut things down. Kind of a scary moment - not a pleasant thought to have it be EITHER the antenna OR the amplifier - neither would be fun.

But I stepped back - took a breath - and started breaking things down, device by device.

FIRST thing was to connect my AA-600 directly to the SteppIR right at the patch bay, bypassing everything else, and sweep the band I was on when things went poof. WHEW! 15m swept just fine. For good measure I then swept all bands - another WHEW! OK - the antenna is fine.

So then one cable at a time I started ruling things out - gotta be a cable that's gone open? I'm thinking.

Finally though, the LAST thing I ever expected was clearly revealed: Position #1 of the Alpha Delta antenna switch had failed! I never would have expected that at all - especially given the "common knowledge" of how robust AD switches are.

I had another brand new identical switch on hand, and installed it back into the patch bay - and back in business. Everything is back online

So just a good example of "step back, and methodically work the problem to rule out all the working stuff - the bad stuff will reveal itself as long as you never skip a step".

# Legislation To Remove Private Land Use Restrictions on Amateur Radio Introduced in Congress

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023 – Congressmen Bill Johnson (OH-06) and Joe Courtney (CT-02) reintroduced a bill in the US House of Representatives on June 12 — H.R.4006 (see full text of bill in this PDF) — to remove private land use restrictions that prohibit, restrict, or impair the ability of Amateur Radio operators from operating and installing reasonable antennas on property that they own or control. Similar legislation, H.R. 9670, was introduced by Congressman Johnson in 2022.

"I reintroduced the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act to remove barriers to disaster and emergency communications and training, and to promote education in STEM subjects related to critically needed wireless technology," Congressman Johnson said in a release. "Passage of this bill will promote developing and sustaining our nation's wireless future and facilitate and encourage amateur radio operations as a public benefit."

"As their actions during recent natural disasters such as Hurricane Sandy proved, amateur radio operators in Connecticut can be a critical component of disaster response and emergency management. It is in our communities' best interest that we give them the capabilities to operate at the highest level, and with the re-introduction of this bill, we've taken a strong step in that direction," said Congressman Courtney.

The exponential growth of communities bound by private land use restrictions that prohibit both the operation of Amateur Radio and the installation of amateur station antennas has significantly restricted the growth of the Amateur Radio Service.

ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® continues its multi-year efforts to eliminate private land use restrictions that prevent Amateur Radio operations and has pledged to strongly support Congressman Johnson and Congressman Courtney in their efforts on behalf of Amateur Radio.

Rick Roderick K5UR, President of ARRL, on behalf its Members and America's Amateur Radio community extended his thanks and appreciation for the leadership of Congressman Johnson and Congressman Courtney in their tireless efforts to support and protect the rights of all Amateur Radio Operators and to further STEM education and the advancement of American expertise in wireless technology.



## FCC ULS System Restored

Newington, CT, June 27th, 2023 – The FCC Universal Licensing System (ULS) has resumed operations, including the Electronic Batch Filing system (EBF).

As of June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023, all systems have been reported to be working. However, visitors to the website will see a message referring them to Public Notice DA 23-529 for additional information and guidance on filing deadline extensions.

The systems were first reported unavailable on June 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

On Friday afternoon, June 23<sup>rd</sup>, the EBF system was restored. All VEC organizations use that system for filing exam sessions, individual applications, and club license applications. ARRL VEC staff worked late into Friday night to ensure all backlogged sessions and application files were transmitted to the FCC before the weekend. Approximately 350 backlogged files were successfully submitted to and processed by the FCC before the system's normal shutdown at 8 PM.

Newington, CT, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023 – On Wednesday morning, June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the FCC had reopened the Universal Licensing System (ULS) and supporting systems, according to an email distributed to VEC organizations. However, as of 4:00 PM on Wednesday, the Electronic Batch Filing (EBF) system, used by VEC organizations for filing exam sessions, individual applications, and club license applications, was still not available as promised. Unfortunately, this means applications for new and upgraded licenses, and individual and club license filings still cannot be uploaded in the system for issuance.

When the EBF system becomes available, the Commission is requesting VECs to limit submissions into the filing system. In an email sent by the FCC, all EBF filers were asked to adhere to a restricted upload schedule in order to keep the EBF system stable and to avoid any potential technical problems. The FCC will be monitoring to ensure the EBF system is stable during this reopening period. If they assess that the upload volume is too high, they will send out another notice with directions to reduce the amount of uploads per hour.

ARRL VEC will comply with the FCC directive, limiting our transmissions but sending as many backlogged sessions as possible without overloading their system. The files will be submitted to the FCC in the order in which they were received, starting with the files from Monday, June 12<sup>th</sup>, and moving forward from there. ARRL VEC will begin submitting the backlogged applications as soon as the EBF system becomes available, and assuming all FCC systems remain stable.

In an FCC notice published on June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023 (https://www.fcc.gov/document/uls-tcns-e-106-and-asr-available), the Commission provided a deadline extension for filings in the ULS and the Antenna Structure Registration (ASR) system, explaining, "Because parties could not make electronic filings or view the contents of the affected systems while they were unavailable, we are extending the deadlines for all regulatory filings that were due in the affected systems between June 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023, and June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023, until Friday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023. We note that we have provided for a longer extension for these filings than initially contemplated in the June

9"', 2023, and June 29"', 2023, until Friday, June 30"', 2023. We note that we have provided for a longer extension for these filings than initially contemplated in the June 13th Public Notice in anticipation of high traffic volumes on these systems in the coming days. In that regard, we encourage filers to consider deferring discretionary filings this week, and we encourage filers preparing large submissions to coordinate in advance with [the] staff of the Bureaus."

## Cambodia Licensing Update

Honolulu, HI, June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023 (via OPDX) – I send you the latest situation about amateur radio operation in Cambodia.

Since the beginning of 2021, Cambodia government changed the procedure for the licensing of amateur radio. During Jan 2021 ? May 2023, there were no legal amateur radio stations which were permitted from Cambodia government due to no way to renew or issue license.

After lots of enthusiastic negotiation with Cambodia government by local exlicense holders, amateur radio licensing has been resumed from June 2023. I got the same callsign "XU7AKU" in June 2023 as previous operation of 2020 as the first licensee for new licensing system in Cambodia.

## **FCC News**

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, June 5th, 2023 - An investigation by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) results in a large fine against a California amateur radio license holder.

A Notice of Apparent Liability Forfeiture (NALF) for \$24,000 has been filed against Phillip J. Beaudet N6PJB, of Burney, California.

According to the filing, the penalty is for Beaudet "willfully and repeatedly interfering with the radio communications of the Western Amateur Radio Friendship Association (WARFA) while it was attempting to hold a regularly scheduled net and for failing to provide station identification on amateur radio frequencies.

FCC agents used direction finding techniques during November and December of 2022 to track the interfering signals to Beaudet's home station (\*). Agents "heard him playing recordings on 3.908 MHz that caused interference to the ongoing WARFA net while failing to provide his assigned amateur call sign," the document stated.

#### (\*) From the NALF:

- The Commission has received numerous complaints alleging that Beaudet caused intentional interference to other amateur radio operators using frequency 3.908 MHz and failed to transmit his assigned call sign, in apparent violation of section 333 of the Act, and sections 97.101(d) and 97.119(a) of the Commission's rules. On November 22, 2022, in response to continued complaints alleging intentional interference to amateur radio communications, an agent from the San Francisco Field Office (San Francisco Office) of the Federal Communications Commission's Enforcement Bureau (Bureau) drove to Burney, California, to investigate the complaints. The agent monitored frequency 3.908 MHz and used direction finding techniques to identify the source of the transmissions as Beaudet's amateur radio station, N6PJB, which he was operating at his residence in Burney, California. The agent monitored the transmissions emanating from Beaudet's residence on his station for approximately two hours that evening and heard him playing recordings on 3.908 MHz that caused interference to the ongoing WARFA net while failing to provide his assigned amateur call sign.
- On November 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022, an agent from the San Francisco Office drove to Burney, California, to continue to investigate the complaints. The agent monitored frequency 3.908 MHz and used direction finding techniques again to identify the source of the transmissions as Beaudet's amateur radio station, N6PJB, which he was operating at his residence in Burney, California. The agent monitored the transmissions emanating from Beaudet's station for approximately an hour and a half that evening and heard him playing recordings on 3.908 MHz, causing interference to the ongoing WARFA net and again failing to identify with his assigned call sign. On December 1st, 2022, an agent from the San Francisco Office again returned to Burney, California, to continue to investigate the complaints. Once again, the agent monitored frequency 3.908 MHz and using direction findings techniques identified the source of the transmissions as Beaudet's amateur radio station, which he was operating at his residence in Burney, California. The agent monitored the transmissions from Beaudet's station for approximately one hour that evening and heard Beaudet playing recordings on 3.908 MHz causing interference to the ongoing WARFA net without providing his assigned call sign.


