A Message From ARRL President Rick Roderick K5UR

Little Rock, AR, July 23rd, 2023 - Dear ARRL members,

Yesterday, the ARRL Board of Directors completed their second annual meeting. I'm writing to let you know that they made the tough, but necessary, decision to increase the regular membership dues rate to \$59 a year starting January 1, 2024 (see 2024 Dues Rates). Additionally, we have chosen to separate the printed, mailed magazine from regular membership. Members will be able to choose whether they want to add-on a print subscription to any of our magazines including QST, On the Air, QEX, and NCJ. All members will continue to have online, digital access to each of these four magazines and the digital archive as part of their regular membership benefits.

This is only the second time in 22 years that ARRL has raised our dues. It is a necessary part of ensuring ARRL is supported so we can continue to promote and fight hard for our Amateur Radio Service, while providing benefits and services for our members that increase your knowledge and enjoyment of ham radio.

To help us make this decision, we invited every ARRL member to participate in a survey in May. Over 20,000 members responded (you can view the survey results here). We know from the survey results that most of you will find the new rate reasonable, or even ask why we didn't set it higher. We also know that some may find the rate is too high. As I've shared with many of you during my visits at hamfests and conventions, each of us has a responsibility to be active participants, and to support ARRL if we want to increase our ranks and ensure a lasting legacy for amateur radio's future.

You told us that you value ARRL's advocacy efforts, including spectrum defense, standing up to regulators and policymakers, and our work in other areas that defend, promote, and grow amateur radio - including STEM outreach to schools, teachers, and youth. There is no other organization that is working harder to advance a vision that allows any citizen to explore, develop, and practice radio communications and radio technology.

Your feedback showed us the many benefits, services, and programs you use - from Logbook of The World, to the work done by the ARRL Lab to test equipment for product reviews. While our magazines topped the list of benefits, many of you also shared that your reading preferences have changed. Some of you prefer print, and increasingly members prefer digital. As a result, for those who prefer print, you will be able to subscribe to *QST* and/or *On the Air* magazine. Again, all members will continue to have access to the digital editions of all four ARRL magazines.

Have you ever heard a Life Member say, "I got a good deal when I signed up for Life Membership 25 (or 30, or 40...) years ago." They're right! They got a good deal, but continuing to serve Life members is not sustainable without making some changes. So, we're going to freeze new applications for the program, not adding any new Life Memberships until we can price the offering to be revenue neutral over its term. And, again, as more members prefer digital, we'll be asking current Life Members to opt-in if they want to continue to receive *QST* by mail.

The cost of doing business goes up every year. During the last couple of years, the costs associated with printing and postage have increased significantly. We've cut and delayed hiring for some positions on our professional staff - one of the smallest teams we've had staffing our headquarters in Newington, Connecticut, in years. We are also continuing to examine other cost-saving measures, but we cannot go further without reducing or eliminating benefits and programs which our members have told us are important to them.

I can assure you that the ARRL Board exercises due diligence and oversight in making sure your association is a good steward of your membership dollars. The reality is that ARRL does a lot - in fact much more than dues cover.

ARRL shares your passion for amateur radio. We are committed to strengthening and growing our community, and protecting our rights to use and experiment on our amateur radio spectrum. We have a 109-year track record that includes YOU as part of that ongoing legacy of support for amateur radio and ARRL.

Commercial Interests Petition FCC for High Power Shortwave Allocation

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, July11th, 2023 – The ad hoc group "Shortwave Modernization Coalition" petitioned the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to allow data communications on multiple bands within the HF 2 – 25 MHz range with up to 20 KW, including in bands immediately adjacent to spectrum allocated to the Amateur Radio Service. This group appears to represent high-speed stock trading interests.

ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® is treating the petition as a subject of concern for its members and the greater Amateur Radio Service. ARRL Laboratory staff are studying the matter from a technical standpoint, including analysis of transmitted signals potentially interfering with Amateur Radio communications on Amateur Radio spectrum. The results from this expert review are being finalized and will inform ARRL's filed comments on the matter.



The FCC has assigned the petition RM-11953. Comments are due by July 31st, 2023, and reply comments by August 15th. While the petitioners exclude the amateur bands, high power operations on immediately adjacent bands are proposed.

Update: Newington, CT, July 31st, 2023 – Since May, ARRL has been reviewing the rules proposed in a petition before the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) from the "Shortwave Modernization Coalition" (SMC). The ARRL Laboratory has been studying the petition out of concern for potential interference to Amateur Radio communications.

Comments on the petition, RM-11953, were due to FCC by July 31st, 2023. However, a 30-day extension of time was requested by both Skywave Networks LLC and FlexRadio Systems.

The timely request from Skywave automatically triggered an extension to the filing deadline. Under FCC rules, when a request for extension is made within the appropriate timeframe, commenters may file comments until a date set by FCC when it rules on the extension request, or no earlier than two business days after the FCC decision. On Monday, July 31st, the FCC denied the request for extension. Comments therefore may continue to be filed through Wednesday, August 2nd.

In its petition, SMC, a group that appears to represent high-speed stock trading interests, has proposed amending the FCC Part 90 rules to allow introduction of high-power digital communications to the shortwave spectrum that in many instances is immediately adjacent to the amateur HF bands.

ARRL's comments on the matter will be based on the analysis by its laboratory and guided by its experienced Washington, D.C. regulatory affairs counsel. ARRL will use the extension to best represent the interests of its members and the Amateur Radio Service.

It's Not the Money

An Editorial

Pittsburgh, PA, July 28th, 2023 – I have been a continuous member of the ARRL since a few months after getting my Novice ticket in 1972. I've seen a lot of changes in the organization, a lot of changes in Amateur Radio, a tremendous growth in US Amateur licenses, and (in recent years) a lot of things changing and not always for the better.

A great deal of recent events have left me troubled. The announcement a few days ago, regarding the recent decision from the ARRL Board (see K5UR's letter on Page 8) is not sitting well with me, and it makes me wonder where the League is heading these days.

It's not the money. Yes, a 20% increase in annual dues was long overdue – and should have been done, in increments, over the last 8 to 10 years. And it's not the money, *per se*, relatively speaking it's not THAT much of an increase. But it makes me wonder why it took so long, and required a significant percentage increase. Current and former ARRL officials I've spoken or corresponded with have indicated that the issue simply was put off, year after year, until the Board had no choice but to do this much now for financial reasons – it was at the point that they had no choice. Really? It took this long? And no one would officially face it, or at least propose it, let alone support it?

Of bigger issue is the upcoming surcharge of \$25 for those who want to retain getting *QST*. You can argue, successfully I think, that the magazine isn't what it used to be in it's heyday. But it is still the official organ of our membership organization – yes, OUR organization, because we Amateurs ARE the ARRL, not the Board, not the elected or appointed officials or staff, not the hired staff working in Newington. Yes, I get it, postage and printing costs are sky high too. Again, that's not the point. It bothers me that those who renew and want to retain the magazine are effectively looking at an approximate 72% dues increase – almost double – which should never have happened in one fell swoop. It bothers me that members are told that the electronic versions will be free (for now, at least), but retaining the clunky (at best) method of reading it that we currently have. [And what happens to your saved archive, if and when there is a change in provider or format, and all of the 'old' electronic versions are now unreadable or have to be deleted? It's already happened once before.]

Results from a survey made available a few weeks ago to ARRL members appears to support the changes that were adopted. That survey struck me as weighted, so that no matter how carefully you answered the guestions, the pre-determined results would prevail. And so they did.

But what troubles me most is what appears to be happening behind the scenes. Rumors and whispering from reliable sources – insiders who are afraid of being publicly identified because they fear retaliation, and really, this – THIS? – is happening within OUR organization? – indicate that the current ARRL CEO, David Minster NA2AA, is working to remove from the Board and from the Staff those who choose to disagree with him, to put it mildly. Former Hudson Division Director Ria Jairam N2RJ is one such, who has indicated that several simple disagreements (on things such as retaining the ARRL E-Mail Forwarding System for members, which lets you use your call @ arrl.net for such purposes) led to her being forced to resign, after being marginalized in her effectiveness. [Disclaimer: I have known Ria a long time and consider her a friend... but we do not always agree on many specific issues. Which is as it should be.] Stories circulate that several other ARRL Board members are leaving or have left over similar circumstances. At one point, very recently, 6 to 7 Board members compromised a more "liberal" block looking for reform... and now that group is down to 4 and shrinking.

Our sitting Atlantic Division Director, Bob Famiglio K3RF, is another Board member rumored to be on the short list to be pushed out. Simply for not always blindly backing the current CEO. [And this isn't the first time that a stunt on these lines has been pulled on Bob... anyone else remember the bogus "disqualification" that kept him off the ballot a few years back?]

Word is that Southwestern Division Director Dick Norton N6AA is under scrutiny by the Ethics and Elections Committee. Again... he's another one who has been through this before, only to see the bogus accusations or issues disappear once they came under public scrutiny.

Many long time ARRL staff members have been leaving or retiring in the last few years, many of whom seemed at one time or another to be "lifers." Not all talk about it, but if you read the forums on Amateur Radio sites like QRZ.COM and eHam.net, let along social media sites like Facebook and Twitter... a lot of different people seem to be talking about how they got pushed out, or felt that they had no choice.

There are other, similar rumors floating around, especially involving Life Members and how the CEO appears to feel about them. Suffice to say that these are not good.

Are some of these stories, at best, exaggerated? Maybe. But where there's smoke...

This is not what I think the ARRL should be spending time, money, or effort on. We have spectrum to defend... did you know that there actually isn't a separate Spectrum Defense Fund, even though they raise money for one, but the funds go into the "general pool" and can actually be used for any purpose? We have interference concerns. We have private "governments" like HOA's that try (and succeed) to limit antennas and other operating for reasons that often make no logical or legal sense. We have an aging Amateur population (the median age keeps rising) and need to try and bring younger people with new ideas into the fold. We have new technologies to adapt... and sometimes to make adapt to us.

And our national organization is concerned with getting rid of people who don't toe the Party line?

It's not the dues. We have some major, major problems at the very top of the ARRL. If they aren't addressed and remedied... and soon... we won't have to worry about another dues increase in a few more years; there won't be a viable organization left to pay those dues to anyway.

A radio experiment held on July 26th, 2023, to decode a slow-scan TV (SSTV) message sent via the ham radio station on the International Space Station (ISS) was successful.

The image was received by a group of educators at the headquarters of the ARRL through the voice repeater on the ISS. Teachers from around the United States were on hand for the ARRL Teachers Institute on Wireless Technology, a program that empowers educators to incorporate amateur radio into their science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) curriculum. As part of the professional development program, the group received and decoded the image sent by volunteers with Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS). The transmitted image said, "ARRL Teachers Institute: ensuring a space for radio in the next generation."

The teachers thought it was cool. "Amateur radio is so important to the future of engineering and STEM in our country," said
Kristen Kucko KQ4ECP, one of the institute participants. The group gathered outside ARRL Headquarters with antennas they had
made earlier in the day. As the pass happened, the educators tracked the ISS by hand. A warble of SSTV transmission filled the air, and the group was excited.
After the pass, they used laptops to decode the audio stream into an image, while they sat on picnic tables and enjoyed pizza and wings.

For ARRL Education and Learning Manager Steve Goodgame K5ATA, the experiment was a way to allow teachers to engage with the power of radio. "When teachers can pull an image off the ISS via amateur radio, it gives a sense of accomplishment that gets them excited. We want to get them fired up about radio, so they can carry that energy back to their classrooms and do the same thing with their students," said Goodgame.

Each of the teachers on hand for the second phase of the institute, -- "TI-2: Remote Sensing and Data Analysis," -- have already been through the introductory course and they are all licensed radio amateurs. The institute costs teachers nothing to attend, thanks to funding from the ARRL Education & Technology Program.

Call for Nominations for ARRI Director and Vice Director

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, July 6th, 2023 – Attention to full ARRL members in the Atlantic, Dakota, Delta, Great Lakes, and Midwest Divisions. You have the opportunity to choose a Director and a Vice Director to represent you for a 3-year term beginning January 1st, 2024.

ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® is governed by its Board of Directors. A voting Director is chosen by ballot by the full (licensed) ARRL members in each of its 15 Divisions. Vice Directors, who serve in the absence of the Director at a Board meeting and succeed to the position of Director should a vacancy occur, are chosen at the same time. Elections are held in five Divisions per year. It only takes 10 full members in a Division to nominate a candidate for either office.

Qualifications

The eligibility of nominees for the positions of ARRL Director and Vice Director will be reviewed by the Ethics & Elections Committee, composed of three Directors not subject to election this year: Kristen McIntyre K6WX; Carl Luetzelschwab K9LA, and Jeff Ryan KØRM. A nominee must be at least 21 years old and must have been licensed and a full member of ARRL for a continuous term of at least 4 years immediately preceding nomination. Each nominee must provide information concerning their employment, ownership, and investment interests, and other financial arrangements to ensure compliance with the Conflict of Interest Policy (see Article 12 of the ARRL Articles of Association and Bylaw 46, available at www.arrl.org/general-information). The qualifications for Director and Vice Director are identical. All the powers of the Director are transferred to the Vice Director in the event of the Director's death, resignation, recall, move outside the Division, or inability to serve.



Nomination Procedure

- Step 1: Obtain official nominating petition forms. Any full member residing in a Division where there is an election may request an official nominating petition package in writing, either by letter or via email to ExecAdmin@arrl.org. The request must reach the ARRL Secretary no later than noon EDT on Friday, August 11, 2023. If you are seriously considering running or nominating someone to run, please don't wait until the last minute to request the forms; the deadline for submitting a completed petition form is just 1 week later.
- Step 2: Obtain signatures and complete questionnaire. Only the official form may be used. To be valid, a nominating petition must name the candidate and must bear legible signatures of 10 full members of the Division. The candidate must complete the candidate's Questionnaire, providing the information required to determine eligibility, certifying its accuracy, and agreeing to assume the office if elected.
- Step 3: Submit petition form. The completed form must reach the Secretary no later than noon EDT on Friday, August 18th, 2023. The submission may be made by electronic transmission of images (i.e., .jpg format at a minimum of 200 dpi attachment to an email) or facsimile provided that, upon request, the original documents are received by the Secretary within 7 days of the request. A person who is nominated for both Director and Vice Director may choose to decline the nomination for Director; otherwise the nomination for Director will stand and that for Vice Director will be void.

On Monday, August 21st, 2023, the Secretary will notify each candidate of the name and call sign of each other candidate for the same office. Candidates will then have until Friday, September 1st, 2023, to submit a 300- word statement and a photograph, if they desire these to accompany the ballot, in accordance with instructions that will be supplied.

Balloting

If there is only one eligible candidate for an office, they will be declared elected by the Ethics & Elections Committee. If there is more than one eligible candidate for an office, the full members in that Division who are in good standing as of September 10th, 2023, will have the opportunity to cast ballots. Official paper ballots and candidates' statements will be mailed and be made available electronically to members who are eligible to vote no later than October 1st, 2023. Completed ballots must be received at the designated address in the envelope provided or cast an electronic vote by noon Eastern time on Friday, November 17th, 2023. The candidate receiving the most votes will be declared the winner.

Absentee Ballots

A full member who is residing temporarily outside his or her home Division, including overseas, may arrange to vote in their home Division by notifying the Secretary prior to September 10th, 2023, giving their current mailing address as reflected in the ARRL membership records (i.e. QST mailing address) and the reason why another Division is considered home. Members with overseas military addresses should take special note of this provision; in the absence of information received to the contrary, ballots will be sent to them based on their postal addresses.




Babcock Grove is located on Sesqui Drive in South Park. (See map below left)
