The drive is about 90 minutes and we set up in Casselman Bridge State Park, In addition to operating in the party we wanted to test our brand new end fed antenna designed and built by Glen Roberts KE7FD.

As it turned out the antenna worked very well but the Party part of our day was a flop. It seemed that there was little to no activity (at least none we could hear). Mike and Kathy worked sixteen stations on 40 phone but I don't think any were in Maryland or DC. Larry worked a seven CW

stations (very few) and I worked a grand total of one Maryland call,N3QE from Montgomery County who had a bodacious signal.

Admittedly Saturday morning is prime lawn mowing and chore time with radio delayed until later in the day but we really thought we would work lots of





stations. Mike and Kathy worked stations all over the Northeast and Canada so the new wire performed well even though it was only about 20 feet high at the high end of the sloper.

We also tried hamsticks set up as a dipole and two 108 inch mobile whips configured as a dipole, The Icom AH-4 tuner mad Larry's Icom 7100 happy with whatever antenna we threw it's way. It's a wonderful piece of gear but it didn't help us hear or be heard better. Looking at the 3830 website quite a few stations reported activity but most of the activity was on phone and we don't know when they were in the air. Even though we didn't do well we enjoyed ourselves being outside in a beautiful summer day and hopefully we can get out again soon.

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, August 2nd, 2023 - ARRL_The National Association for Amateur Radio®, as part of its mission to protect Amateur Radio, has filed comments against a proposal that would introduce high-power digital communications to the shortwave spectrum that in many instances is immediately adjacent to the Amateur HF bands.

The "Shortwave Modernization Coalition" (SMC), which represents certain high-frequency stock trading interests, filed the petition with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). ARRL responded on behalf of its members and the 760,000 licensees of the Amateur Radio Service in the US.

The ARRL Laboratory performed a detailed technical analysis over several months to determine if the proposed rules would affect operations on the bands allocated to Radio Amateurs that are inter-mixed with the Part 90 bands in the spectrum in question.

ARRL's analysis determined that, if the proposed rules are adopted, the new operations inevitably will cause significant harmful interference to many users of adjacent and nearby spectrum, including Amateur Radio licensees. Ed Hare W1RFI, a 37-year veteran of the ARRL Lab and internationally recognized expert on radio frequency interference, was the principal investigator on the study. Hare concluded the petition should not be granted. "This petition seeks to put 50 kHz wide, 20,000-watt signals immediately next to seven different amateur bands with weaker protections against interference than required in other services," said Hare.

Pittsburgh, PA, September 4th, 2023 – It is disappointing that the concerns raised in last month's editorial are so summarily dismissed out of hand with no further explanation.

The most important aspect is the \$25 annual surcharge for those who still wish to receive *QST* in the mail. This may not seem important... but it is. It is a membership benefit that dates back to the beginning of the organization. Allegedly the ARRL "lost" about \$1.6 Million on this benefit last year. But... so what? Since when was the membership journal supposed to be a money maker? No, I'm not saying that the League should spend money hand over fist to provide the publication, but a relatively small "loss" for a membership benefit shouldn't be that important.

The math is simple. Presume ARRL membership stays at about 160,000 members, give or take. Presume there is a QST printed and mailed for each one. So that "loss" is what... \$10 per member per year? Yes, I know the details matter and there are lot of factors not in play. But we're talking \$10 per member per year.

Why is a printed *QST* important? Well, the *faux pas* on the original September 2023 cover (right) is a perfect example. See it? Talk about "wireless" communications. OK, I know the photo was taken (and staged by) the students, and it was a simple mistake. It happens. But the photo could and should have been easily cropped before publication to "cover" this simple mistake. And it was... AFTER the printed edition went out. So those seeing it electronically won't see it. And that's my point... what other changes could be made to electronic publications after the fact, if something <u>really</u> important (to the membership) comes to light, that someone decides should now be covered up?

So no, I don't believe a surcharge is warranted or acceptable. An annual dues increase? Overdue. But a surcharge for a membership benefit? No.

I also disagree that this "surcharge" will be put into effect across the board on January 1st. Anyone whose membership has not expired prior to that date has an implied agreement with the ARRL that in return for their dues (be it per year, multiple years, or a Life Membership) they will receive *QST*— unless they choose to opt out, as is their prerogative. Imposing the surcharge on CURRENT members after the fact is an implied breach of that agreement. Whether or not it is a legal one is not the point... it is an ethical one.

So exactly what was based on "internet rumors"? That the survey was a sham? (See https://forums.grz.com/index.php?threads/arrl-now-59-per-year.873769/ Post #1914) The monetary "loss"? (See K1OIK video on the August 26th, 2023 Hamxposition https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kwIPG2qZC_c&t=4s)? The 2017 disqualification of K3RF for an alleged "conflict of interest"? (http://www.myarrlvoice.org/wp-content/uploads/Cummulative-Chron-Corresp-re-EE-K3RF.pdf)

I am still a believer in the ARRL. But I do not like the direction I see the organization going towards. This is supposed to be a membership organization to benefit the members in particular and the Amateur Radio Service in general. But just as started to happen (and was stopped) a few years ago, it seems some are intent on changing it into something else... an organization that the members are not the focus of, but merely the people who pay money every year. And to the benefit of whom?

I would be remiss as a Member not to ask questions and point out what I don't like and think is wrong.

In its formal opposition, ARRL stated, "That destructive interference would result if operations commenced using anything close to the proposed maximum levels."

ARRL's filed comments highlight flawed analysis and incomplete data submitted by the petitioners. It noted the petitioners "...significantly understate the harmful interference that is not just likely, but certain, if the rules proposed by SMC are adopted as proposed. It is noteworthy that SMC's proposed rules would provide less protection than the much-lower power amateur radio transmitters are required to provide Part 90 receivers." ARRL's opposition also noted that there was no reported tests conducted with Amateur or other affected stations, but referenced a spectrum capture in the Comments filed with the Dayton Group that showed actual interference into the Amateur 20-meter band from one of the High Frequency Trading experimental stations.

Part 90 HF rules currently authorize a maximum signal bandwidth equal to a voice communications channel, at up to 1000 W peak envelope power (PEP). The petition seeks multiplication of signal width, greater transmitted power, and weaker rules that protect users of adjacent spectrum. ARRL's comments expose the likely fallout:

"Incredibly, notwithstanding the significant increase in potential interference that would result from using digital schemes with 50 kHz bandwidths and 20,000 watts of power, SMC also proposes to substantially lessen the protections required to protect adjacent and neighboring licensees. SMC proposes [out-of-band emissions] limits that offer less protection than the existing Part 90 limits and would actually permit no attenuation (0 dB) at the edge of adjacent allocations, many of which are bands allocated to and heavily used in the Amateur Radio Service. Consistent with lessening protections while increasing the potential for harmful interference, SMC also proposes a lower limit for spurious emissions. SMC would reduce the existing protection of -73 dB for the applicable 1000-watt power limit to just -50 dB protection for their proposed 20,000-watt limit. Due to the much wider 50 kHz proposed bandwidth, the resulting interference would penetrate deep into the adjacent Amateur bands."

The proposal has been assigned FCC Docket No. RM-11953. While the period for commenting on the petition has now closed, replies to comments in the record may now be submitted.

Hundreds of licensed Radio Amateurs filed comments in the Docket, expressing overwhelming opposition to the proposal. Those interested may read ARRL's full comments and the results of the technical analysis, which are included in the filing. "If granted as written, this would be devastating to Amateur operation for many tens of kHz into our bands," said Hare.

Full sheet of 50 (fifty) historic 1964 US Amateur Radio Postage Stamps. (More Than One Available)

Originally issued on December 15th, **1964** these Postage Stamps were specifically commissioned to honor the nation's 250,000 hams. The release fell on the 50th anniversary of the founding of the American Radio Relay

League, (ARRL) and was first made available for purchase in Anchorage, Alaska where amateur radio operators played an important role in the aftermath of The Great Alaskan Earthquake on March 27^{th} of that year.

The purple vertical stamp was designed by Emil J. Willett of Hartford, CT and combines a radio broadcast sine wave with a partial radio dial. Nearly 60 years later, these are cherished by amateur radio operators around the world.

Newington, CT, August 30th, -- ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® has received approval from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for an emergency waiver to facilitate amateur radio emergency communications for hurricane relief.

The request, filed by the ARRL Washington DC Counsel on August 29th, 2023, seeks a waiver of HF symbol rate restrictions.

Trained radio amateurs involved with the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and other communications support groups are working with federal, state, and local emergency management officials and relief organizations to assist with disaster relief communications in anticipation of the arrival of Hurricane Idalia at the Florida coast. Their equipment includes radio modems and computers that are capable of data transmissions that exceed the regulatory baud symbol rate limit yet use the same or less bandwidth as slower-speed protocols that are permitted. The higher data rates are critical to sending the anticipated relief communications, including lists of needed and distributed supplies, etc. Many other amateur stations involved in disaster relief communications are able to use the higher-speed emissions from their stations inside and outside the anticipated landfall area or involved areas to assist in the communication efforts.

The waiver, which was granted August 30th, is for a 60-day relief period from the rules, based upon the immediate need related to the threat of Hurricane Idalia. It would cover use directly related to any additional hurricanes that may develop within the 60-day period. Only messages related to these hurricanes would be permitted to be sent via the higher-speed modes, and only publicly documented modes would be allowed.

ARRL Director of Emergency Management Josh Johnston KE5MHV said the rate increase will help response abilities. "The increased symbol rate provides for faster more efficient message transmissions for digital communications. These modes such as WINLINK are used to send forms for served agencies and other data that can be vital during a disaster," he said.

Johnston and volunteers of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®) are closely coordinating with ARRL Sections in Florida. The ARRL Northern Florida Section is activated in preparation for Hurricane Idalia. ARES volunteers are staffing the auxiliary communications position at the Florida Emergency Operations Center, which was activated at 7:00 AM on August 29th

Several other hurricane-related amateur radio nets were active ahead of the storm. Hurricane Idalia strengthened into a category 4 storm briefly in the overnight hours of Wednesday, August $30^{\rm th}$ before being downgraded to category 3. The storm made landfall in the Great Bend region of Florida's Gulf Coast with sustained winds of 120 miles per hour.


