# **Gear**

Scottsdale, AZ, November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023 – If you are like me, when you are shopping you are always on the lookout for something that might improve your shack. Recently, I was in my local Home Depot store looking for a 220v cable for a new linear amplifier I was testing. I found what I needed, and on the way out I spotted these great bulletproof bags made by the tool company Husky. This item is called a Document Bag, and Home Depot (and probably Lowes as well) sells a couple of different sizes. The package I bought gives you a set of four (8" x 12") and I was impressed with their construction. They are super heavy duty and water "resistant," and cost less than \$15. I am amazed at all that I can fit into them. They're easy to customize with your call sign in the spot for this on the outside flap, and you'll have an extra bag or two to pass along to your ham buddies if you don't need all four. The same company makes a smaller set of these bags (great for connectors and short cables) but for me this one is the perfect for my 2-meter J-pole antenna, or a 20-meter dipole and short coax. It's just big enough to hold an HT plus accessories but not so big as to be cumbersome. I would highly recommend them.

About six months ago I watched a YouTuber show off his POTA table, a portable device he got from Amazon. I bought one, but only rate it a C+ versus his A rating. This table (Amazon, Baide Pack item # B0B2P2J69Z) measures 37" by 23" and has two heights, either 21" or 29" high. The major reason I didn't get as much pleasure out of it as my YouTube friend is that it is not all that adjustable to wild terrain; the legs are not infinitely adjustable. You can have the legs placed in one of two positions, so it must stand on a flat surface. In my backyard, POTA is done in rocky terrain and desert parks where the ground is anything but flat. If you're regularly out in the grass somewhere at an urban park, you'd be fine with one of these and they are darn convenient.

I would rate the build quality of this table to be a C and the usability factor to be a B. It's a pleasure to have a flat surface this large for your radio and laptop, and then to be able to dissemble it easily and pack it into a small package to carry back to the car – it weighs about 12lbs and takes two minutes to put together or take apart. The cost varies by time of year and coupon used, but always in the range of \$55 to \$65.



American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023 – ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® announces the results of the 2023 ARRL Division elections.

ARRL Great Lakes Division Vice Director Scott Yonally N8SY (2,175 votes), of Lexington, Ohio, defeated candidate Michael Kalter W8CI (2,023 votes), for the position of Division Director. Yonally will assume the role when Director Dale Williams WA8EFK, who has held the seat since 2014, completes his current term at the end of the year.

In the Atlantic Division, Vice Director Martin Pittinger KB3MXM (2,801 votes), of Owings Mills, Maryland, defeated candidate Robert Weinstock W3RQ (1,044 votes) for the seat.

In the Dakota Division, Vice Director Lynn Nelson WØND (656 votes), of Minot, North Dakota, defeated candidate Matthew Holden KØBBC (519 votes).

Winners will assume their roles for terms beginning January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.


Members had the option to vote using paper or electronic ballots. The election was conducted by third party Election Services Co., of Melville, New York -- the same company that conducted ARRL elections in 2022. The tabulation was observed by Director of the ARRL Pacific Division Kristen McIntyre K6WX, who chairs the ARRL Ethics and Elections Committee.

Those were the only contested races in this year's election cycle for Director and Vice Director. In August, the following incumbents, running unopposed in this election cycle, were declared winners: Atlantic Division Director Robert Famiglio K3RF; Dakota Division Director Bill Lippert ACØW; Delta Division Director David Norris K5UZ, and Vice Director Ed Hudgens WB4RHQ.

In the Great Lakes Division, Roy Hook W8REH, will be the next Vice Director. Hook ran unopposed for the seat vacated by Director-elect Yonally.

ARRL is governed by an all-volunteer Board of Directors. Elections are held for five of the 15 ARRL Divisions each year, for terms of 3 years.

Full sheet of 50 (fifty) historic 1964 US Amateur Radio Postage Stamps. (More Than One Available)



For Sale:

**Originally issued on December 15<sup>th</sup>, 1964** these Postage Stamps were specifically commissioned to honor the nation's 250,000 hams. The release fell on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the American Radio Relay League, (ARRL) and was first made available for purchase in Anchorage, Alaska where amateur radio operators played an important role in the aftermath of The Great Alaskan Earthquake on March 27<sup>th</sup> of that year.

The purple vertical stamp was designed by Emil J. Willett of Hartford, CT and combines a radio broadcast sine wave with a partial radio dial. Nearly 60 years later, these are cherished by amateur radio operators around the world.

*Wayne, PA, October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2023* -- The Conditional license played a key role in US Amateur Radio for decades, yet is sometimes forgotten in licensing discussions. The Conditional license began as the Class C license, about 1934. From then until 1951, there were 3 classes of US amateur license:

- Class A full privileges, available by FCC-conducted exam only.
- Class B full privileges EXCEPT no phone operation on the bands between 2.5 and 25 MHz. Available by FCC-conducted exam only
- Class C full privileges EXCEPT no phone operation on the bands between 2.5 and 25 MHz. Available by mail exam using a volunteer examiner (note the
  intentional lack of capital letters). Only available to those living more than 125 miles "airline" from an FCC exam location, or people with permanent physical
  disabilities which prevented them from traveling to an FCC exam session.

All license classes required 13 wpm code tests (sending and receiving) and a written test on regulations, radio theory, and operating practice. Class A also required at least one year as a Class B or Class C plus an additional written test. (Note: before 1936, the code test speed was 10 wpm)

The Class C license had several added....conditions:

- Class C carried no exam credit towards Class A. If a Class C amateur wanted a Class A, they had to not only travel to an FCC exam point but had to pass the Class B tests all over again in front of an FCC examiner, before being allowed to try the Class A exam.
- Class C licensees who violated regulations could be required to appear before an FCC examiner for retesting, regardless of distance, or lose the license.
- Class C licensees who moved to within 125 miles of an FCC exam point had 90 days to appear and pass the Class B exams, or lose the license.

There were no VECs or similar organizations for volunteer examiners. A volunteer examiner could be anyone with a valid Class A or B license, or certain FCC commercial licenses, or certain military or government radio operators. Only a single volunteer examiner was needed. The volunteer examiner would certify the code skill of the prospective amateur but did not grade or check the written exam; it was sent to FCC for grading.

The requirements for a volunteer examiner, and the by-mail exam procedure, varied over time. In no case could a Novice, Technician or Conditional licensee be a volunteer examiner - but there were times when someone who held, or had recently held, a Commercial Radiotelegraph Operator license, or who was or had been a US military or government radiotelegraph operator, could be a volunteer examiner even if they didn't hold an amateur license. There were times when the person who administered the code tests didn't have to be the same person who administered the written tests. All depended on the particular time period.

In 1951, the FCC restructured the US amateur license structure. Three new license classes were added - Novice, Technician, and Amateur Extra. The existing Class A license was renamed Advanced, the existing Class B license was renamed General, and the existing Class C license was renamed Conditional. The test requirements and privileges for existing licenses were unchanged.

The new Amateur Extra license was supposed to replace the Advanced (former Class A) license as the top license, and the FCC announced that there would be no new Advanced licenses issued after the end of 1952. This caused some consternation, because the new Extra license required 2 years experience rather than 1, 20 wpm code rather than 13, and an even more involved written test. So there was a bit of a rush to get Advanced licenses, as the requirements for a full -privileges license were being raised considerably.

But then, in mid-December 1952, FCC announced that all General and Conditional licenses would get full privileges as of mid-February 1953, removing all operational reason to upgrade beyond those licenses. So from February 1953 to November 1968, Conditionals had full privileges without ever having taken an FCC-conducted test.

In 1954, FCC made additional changes. The "Conditional distance" was reduced from 125 to 75 miles "air line".

In 1965, FCC changed the "Conditional distance" to 175 miles, greatly decreasing the places qualifying for Conditional licenses. See QST for April, 1965, pages 34-35 for details, including a map of "Conditional country".

Finally, in 1975 the FCC phased out the Conditional license by renewing all Conditional licenses as General. By 1980 there were none left (because the license term was 5 years back then).

Callbook numbers reveal that Conditionals accounted for about 16% of US amateur in the 1950s and 1960s, and began to decline in the early 1970s. At its peak (about 1968), there were about 43,000 Conditionals.

In the 1953-1968 time period, FCC made other rules changes, most of which benefited 'phone operators:

- The 75 and 20 meter 'phone subbands were widened.
- 40 meters, which had previously been CW-only, got a 'phone subband
- A new band at 15 meters was allocated to amateurs worldwide. It was CW-only in the USA for a short time, but soon got a 'phone subband.

---

Some other history of the Conditional:

- When the phasing out of the Conditional license was being considered, there was a rumor that all Conditionals would have to retest. This rumor was totally
  false, but raised a lot of hackles at the time.
- When "incentive licensing" was in its formative stages, FCC came out with a 1965 plan that included distinctive callsigns for all amateur license classes, so
  that you could tell exactly what license class someone had by their callsign and when you upgraded, your callsign would change. This included
  Conditionals, who would have callsigns with C or D before the numeral. This part of the proposal was not adopted, even

though it would have been a bonanza for the QSL card printers.

The Callbook did not include license class until 1967.



• All FCC licenses earned by tests not administered by FCC are "conditional" licenses. In practice, this means if FCC has a reason to suspect a licensee isn't qualified, they can require retesting in front

of an FCC Examiner in order to retain the license. This "feature" has been used by FCC in the past as an enforcement tool, particularly when FCC suspected that a VE team wasn't following the rules to the letter.

Bay City, MI, November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 — Earlier this year, the U.S. Coast Guard received numerous harassing radio transmissions. Falsely crying mayday and letting loose racial and homophobic slurs, the prankster caused military personnel to search the Saginaw Bay.

Months after a voice analysis implicated him, an amateur radio operator from Huron County is facing federal charges for the illadvised hoax.

According to an affidavit, a special agent with the U.S. Coast Guard on March 20<sup>th</sup> was assigned to investigate two incidents of false distress transmissions made via marine radio VHF Channel 16. Investigators believed the transmissions were made by the same person. The channel is designated by the Federal Communications Commission as the national distress, safety, and calling frequency.

The first incident began about 11 a.m. on March 14<sup>th</sup>, when the Coast Guard Sector Detroit Command Center received four radio transmissions within a 12-minute span.

"Did somebody let a giant g\*\*d\*\* f\*\*\*?" the transmitter asked. Shortly thereafter, the voice uttered vulgarities and a racial slur. Coast Guard personnel told the man to cease his transmissions, advising him he was breaking federal law. In response, the man told them to "eat a big pile of" expletive.

When they asked if he needed assistance, he claimed there was a man in the water near the Bay City Yacht Club. Based on this, personnel deployed rescue assets, with a boat launched by the Coast Guard Station Saginaw River in Essexville. The Coast Guard searched the area for an hour, finding no one in distress. They categorized the matter as a probable hoax.

Minutes after midnight on March 19<sup>th</sup>, the Coast Guard Sector Detroit Command Center received three more transmissions on the same radio channel. "How about you shift to your (expletive) (expletive), you (expletive) (homophobic slur)," the man said. Later, he began stating, "Mayday, mayday, mayday." Asked if he needed assistance, the man stopped replying.

Once again, the Coast Guard prepared to dispatch resources near the Bay City Yacht Club. They also pinpointed the transmissions as coming from the area of 10<sup>th</sup> Street in Sebewaing, within Huron County. At this, the Coast Guard determined the transmissions were likely another hoax and declined to dispatch rescue assets.

On March 24<sup>th</sup>, authorities went to the home of Matthew M. Bills, 40, in the 300 block of 10<sup>th</sup> Street. Bills is known as an amateur radio operator and had a large antenna on his residence, the affidavit states. (\*)

Bills later met with investigators at the Sebewaing Harbor Marina. He provided them with a valid amateur FCC license. Bills denied making the transmissions or even having the capacity to do so, though he later said he could monitor and transmit from VHF Channel16 on his boat.

Investigators later sent recordings of the radio transmissions and recordings of Bills' voice to Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh for voice analysis. The college in June completed their analysis, indicating a greater than 98% chance Bills' voice matched that of the man who made the bogus transmissions.

Bills on October 25<sup>th</sup> had his initial appearance before U.S. District Magistrate Judge Patricia T. Morris, who informed him prosecutors had charged him with making a false distress call to the U.S. Coast Guard and making false statements to a federal officer. Both charges are five-year felonies.

Morris freed Bills on a\$10,000 unsecured bond. She set his case for a preliminary examination on November 15<sup>th</sup>.

Newington, CT, November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 – ARRL sought a waiver on behalf of the activators, and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has granted it. The waiver allows amateur radio operators to participate in a special event commemorating the 82nd annual National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.

The Battleship Iowa Amateur Radio Association (BIARA), with authority from the US Navy and Southwest Marine Corps Spectrum Office, will honor the sailors and ships previously homeported in San Pedro, California, who were attacked on December 7<sup>th</sup>, 1941. There will be special crossband activations of NEPM, Battleship Iowa's original call sign, on December 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

Using the call sign NEPM, the club will transmit on assigned military frequencies and listen for calls from the amateur radio community on their adjacent bands. NEPM will transmit on 14.375, 18.1625, and/or 21.856 MHz on J3E/USB and/or A1A/CW. (*Note: 18.1625 MHz is within US amateur allocations for 17 meters*) The club operator will tell participating hams where BIARA will be listening, which will be 10 KHz below the top of each adjacent band when working J3E/USB, or 10 KHz above the bottom of each adjacent band when working A1A/CW. Amateur participants are reminded not to transmit on the NEPM military frequencies. Operations on all 4 days are expected to be from 0700 to 1600 PST (1500 to 2400 UTC).

The FCC stated the grant of the waiver meets the second prong of the waiver standard in section 1.925(b)(3)(ii) in that the event presents a unique opportunity for the amateur and military communities to practice communication skills under the guidance of military officials, which may be useful in the future and serves the public interest.

In addition to the skills gained by amateur operators participating in the test, National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day has historical significance. It emphasizes the importance of reliable communications and the need to be vigilant in national defense.

If amateur radio operators who wish to participate are licensed in a country outside the US, BIARA advises to check the terms and conditions that govern their respective licenses.

*Chisholm, Canberra, Australia November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023* – KOTA is an activity just like POTA or SOTA that gives children and adults a way to connect. It will help bring young minds into the world of amateur radio as well as giving awards to children and adults alike!

DISCLAIMERI: KOTA CANNOT BE USED IN ANY SCOUT ACTIVITIES! That's what SCOTA is for ( Scouts on the air ).

KOTA is a great way for schools to get their students invested into physics and into electrical work! Schools also gain social reputation, possibly resulting in more enrollments for people who enjoy what they learn! In schools, not everyone needs a license, only 1 person / school / club needs to be licensed (Based on your region) so it makes it easy to identify the school / person.

#### Rules / Requirements

KOTA is to be held by Public and Private schools, and any Persons under the age of 21 WITH a ham radio license. Adults are welcome to make contact with the persons under the age of 21, however people over that limit are not allowed to host or start a KOTA activation by themselves, they require a person under the age of 21 to:

- Register their school / age activation for their region (website coming soon!)
- Are the only ones that can operate ANY Transmission equipment for KOTA.
- Must be licensed or under supervision of a licensed ham radio operator, REGARDLESS OF AGE!

Awards can be given to any age group depending on a few factors.

If you are a person over 21, you will only be able to log KOTA contacts based off of school and Age. Rewards will be given for

- 10 contacts with the same age for all ages (under 21) (this will change).
- The school that you contact
- If you are under 21, you will get rewards for the area and distance of contact, Or if another school, the school you contact. Also depending on the number of Contacts you do confirm.

KOTA is a fun place for everyone, but sometimes, people will begin to say things that children may not understand. So it is required to have a person at/over the age of 18 to monitor conversations for persons under 18. This rule is here so we can keep our children safe in the very unlikely event of something going wrong such as:

- Leaking details about their main house location! You can only tell them the school name and state / country as the QTH!
- Leaking any sort of private information (your first name does not count)

For KOTA, it is advised that the area in which the transmission equipment is used in, should be clean of:

- Loose wires
- Screws
- Tools
- Electrical appliances

In the case of any complications related to the equipment, it is a requirement for there to be an emergency power switch to turn off all transmitters. This is incase anything goes wrong. ( A breaker for all outlets does not count, there needs to be a dedicated switch inside of the room).

This document will continue to be updated as KOTA gains more recognition and more regulations are added.


