## A 25th Anniversary Rove



*Upper St. Clair, Pa, March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024* – Kerry and I were celebrating our 25<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary and we wanted to do something to memorialize the occasion, so we planned a trip to New England! The goal of the trip was to visit Acadia National Park (POTA reference US-0001) and to find a geocache and activate a park in each of the three states we had not yet visited in the lower 48, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine. The jaunt

east-northeast across PA was long, but once we crossed the border into New York it looked like the weather was actually going to be very cooperative.

The first of the three states to check off the list was Vermont! Our first planned stop was for Kerry to find the oldest active Geocache in the state, which happened to coincide with the ability for me to active Green Mountain National Forest. While she hiked up the mountain, I set up the antenna. The pile up started almost immediately and did not thin out even when heavy QRM started on the adjacent frequency. After going QRT I found many emails asking to coordinate QSOs with me in the state even though I had just logged 130 QSOs in about an hour. Obviously, I needed to make another stop in the state, but with the day slipping away, we decided to push on to New Hampshire knowing we would pass back through on our way home.

New Hampshire's plan was a repeat of Vermont. Kerry wanted to find the oldest active Geocache in the state which coincided with me activating the Nashua River Rail Trail State Park. The weather was still quite nice for this time of year and the activation was a success with 88 in the log. I did, however, notice that my so far trusty SGC230 (which is feeding a 43-foot wire spiraled around a spiderbeam pole with 9 radials) was not wanting to tune 30, 75, or 160meters. To boot, I was seeing the radio report a higher than usual SWR on 12, 15, and even on 17 meters, but they were usable, and I was making contacts. At the time I figured this may have been partially due to all the granite and did not immediately seek to make any changes, though I should have.

After our successful stop in New Hampshire, we headed towards Portland, Maine, in route for, you guessed it, the oldest active geocache in Maine. Unfortunately, this stop did not coincide with an activatable reference for me, so, while Kerry found the geocache, I did some research for our trip to Acadia and then we checked out the oldest lighthouse in the state, the Portland Head Light, which was in the park. Our next stop on the route to Bar Harbor was Yarmouth where we visited Eartha, the largest rotating globe in the world. Eartha was originally designed and constructed by David DeLorme for the DeLorme Publishing company in 1998. Even though Garmin acquired DeLorme, the awe-inspiring globe still sits in the 3-story atrium of the old Delorme headquarters on display for all whizzing by on I-295 to see.

The following day we set off for our adventure in Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park. With Acadia being the highlight of the trip, of course the weather turned a bit foul, but we did not let that stop us from exploring the park. Unfortunately, even though locals advised us that we could access it, the road up to Cadillac Mountain was still closed for the season, so my choice operating position had to change. We asked for some suggestions and checked out the maps and set out into the park. Once we left the gate, we quickly figured out the comment that "Thunder Hole should be hopping today" was not meant for people we may encounter but the powerful views mother nature had on full display.

The tide was high, the winds brisk, and the sea was driving every wave into the rocky shoreline showing us mere mortals how powerful and dynamic she can be. There were no distant glorious views of nature and the ocean for us to relish or to snap a picture of to put on grand display instead, the fog and haze delivered us an up close and personal experience of how unforgiving the sea can be with the waves compounding in their unrelentless battering of the shore and swallowing up portions of the landscape. It is hard to imagine life not only surviving but flourishing in this kind of environment.

After a few hours exploring and taking in the sights of the various coves and harbors we settled on the Gorham Mountain Trailhead parking lot for the first part of my activation and then we made our way down to Bass harbor and wound up setting up the antenna again at the Ship Harbor Trail Trailhead.



For both locations I set up in the parking lot and operated from my back seat. In the end, I made 209 contacts across 10 bands from 70cm to 60m over the 2 UTC days. I was hoping for 12 bands, but my tuner still wasn't playing nicely and with the rain and winds, it was not the most conducive time for troubleshooting, but it was still a very successful day.

The return trip included an second New Hampshire activation - White Mountain National Forest. Unfortunately, we departed the activation with a cracked windshield and only 20 contacts in the log. The activation was one of the roughest for the least number of contacts due to many unforeseen issues. One of the most difficult being that the temperature dropped to well below freezing and with the rain the day before meant that my still damp Spiderbeam essentially flash froze in the winds and required a propane heater, some dancing, and a little hope to collapse.

Leaving White Mountain National Forest, we set a course west for Vermont. The plan was to find a park that I could remain in after 8pm EDT for a second UTC Day of activating. Looking at our route and the time left we found Thetford Hill State Forest and Park. With a little digging on the state websites and looking at maps for reference I determined this to be a 2-fer with the park clearly inside the State Forest boundary, so off we

went. As we ventured south and into lower elevation the weather warmed up and the winds lightened. By the time we arrived at parking for Thetford all my worries of a second round of thawing a frozen mast had dissipated and I was able to get 51 contacts logged before the new day and another 143 before deciding it was time to break down and head off for something warm to eat and a soft place to sleep for the night.

Our last day on the road led us down into Massachusetts where we stopped for another activation and a history lesson at the Springfield Armory National Historic Site. Unfortunately, the museum is closed on Monday and Tuesday, even though the grounds are open, so we were unable to check out the museum, but it was such a nice morning and the lot being empty yielded an opportune time for a quiet activation. After logging 69 contacts, the sun slowly casting westward, I decided it was time to pack on up and keep moving towards home.

When we arrived and entered, we were a bit bummed to learn that they are no longer giving tours of the HQ building aside from the lobby and any of the things there you may wish to purchase. So, a quick breeze-through the lobby and off we were to visit the station. Upon entering we were greeted by Gary (NQ1G) who gave us the grand tour. I was not planning to operate as I was interested in learning more about the setup and how they operate the multiple stations and multiple modes with several questions. After a while talking, taking some pictures, and then talking some more they convinced both Kerry and I to head into one of the studios to operate a bit. So of course, I opened <a href="http://pota.app">http://pota.app</a> and hunted some parks as W1AW. After taking the obligatory pictures, we collected our certificates and departed for our last leg. We arrived home safely that evening having now logged a geocache in each of the lower 48 states and I have activated parks in 34 of them.

Tirana, Albania, April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 – The mission of The Flat Egg Society is to promote and initiate discussion of flat eggs, specialized chicken husbandry as well as flat egg culinary culture. Our forums act as a venue to encourage free thinking, raising of Albanian Highland Chickens and tasty omelets.

- "You're joking, right?"
- Not at all.
- "Are the eggs really flat?"
- "Flat" eggs aren't completely flat but they are so much shorter/thinner/flatter than regular eggs, the chicken breed has been patented in several European countries.
- "How is that even possible?"
- Nature often offers up unique answers before a question is ever asked. Such was the case with flat eggs and the Albanian Highland Chicken. A long held and closely guarded secret by farmers of the Albanian Highlands, their chickens had the ability to lay oval yet "flat" with a slight bulge, elongated eggs. The traditional Albanian Highland Chicken eggs are smaller than traditional western store bought eggs found in North America but through selective breeding the flat eggs becoming available in greater quantities (in Europe presently) are actually on par of equivalent volume to regular medium store bought eggs. In fact, looking down at a flat egg it's difficult to tell the difference, but look at one from the side you might think your eyes were playing tricks on you.
- "Where can I get flat eggs?
- There's a long waiting list and you would have to travel to the Albanian Highlands to even get close to seeing, let alone eating one. For those who are selected can expect to be rewarded with a culinary treat for their application fee and patience.



# *Repeater Update*

Scenery Hill, PA, February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 – Thank you for your patience with the N3SH 146.955 repeater as it underwent some overdue maintenance and repairs. It was taken out of service on Saturday, February 10th and returned to service on Saturday, February 17th. Updates were made to the controller's firmware and programming. The batteries were replaced in the UPS. Measurements of the duplexer and filters were made and an evaluation of those measurements is forthcoming.

The receiver's pre-amp was OK but showed signs of future issues, so I decided to replace the preamp instead of a repair. The low cost to replace the pre-amp was the determining factor - about \$20. At that cost, I ordered a second pre-amp for future installation at the 442.550 site.



## *International Marconi Day 2024*

Newington, CT, March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 – This year, International Marconi Day (IMD) is on April 27<sup>th</sup>. Italian inventor and electrical engineer Guglielmo Giovanni Maria Marconi was born on April 25<sup>th</sup>, 1874, and is credited for inventing the radiotelegraph system, creating Marconi's law, and sending the first wireless transmission over the open sea.

IMD was created to honor Marconi and is hosted annually by the Cornish Radio Amateur Club, GX4CRC. The purpose of the day is for amateur radio enthusiasts around the world to contact historic Marconi sites using communication techniques similar to those that he would have used.

The 24-hour event will operate from 0000 UTC to 2359 UTC, and registration is required. Participants can register at GX4CRC's registration web page.

Stations in the United States, including Marconi Cape Cod Radio Club KM1CC in Massachusetts are already registering for the event.

KM1CC hosts several on-air events each year to keep the accomplishments and story of Marconi and his wireless station site in South Wellfleet alive. In 1975, the Wellfleet station was listed as a National Historic Landmark on the National Register of Historic Places and is now part of Cape Cod National Seashore, a unit of the National Park Service. When possible, KM1CC sets up a temporary radio station inside the park. More information about KM1CC is available on their Facebook page.



# FCC News

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 – The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has announced an upcoming change to the Commission Registration System (CORES) that licensees use to pay any application or regulatory fees, manage or reset a password on an existing FRN, or request a new FRN.

Beginning March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024, multifactor authentication will be implemented. Users will be prompted to request a six-digit secondary verification code, which will be sent to the email address(es) associated with each username. The user will then need to enter the code into CORES before they can continue.

In a public notice, the FCC said this change will make the system more secure. "This additional layer of security will further safeguard against unauthorized access, thereby enhancing the overall integrity of information contained within the CORES system and improving the security of user data," it read.

The FCC recommends that users confirm they have access to their username account email and to add a secondary email address, if need be.

Resources are available for those who need assistance with the system. For inquiries or assistance regarding the implementation of multifactor authentication on CORES, submit a help request at <a href="https://www.fcc.gov/wtbhelp">https://www.fcc.gov/wtbhelp</a>, or call the FCC at 877-480-3201 (Monday through Friday, 8 AM to 6 PM ET).




