



My goal was to get more people licensed and join ARES (and ACS) as Emcomm Operators -- and to provide a larger future base of volunteers for the Marathon, Rachel Carson, and the Great Race (and other public service events)"





Using the C-Match Antenna at Field Day (and Beyond)

Pittsburgh, PA and Canonsburg, PA, June 30th, 2025 – The C-Match Antenna consists of a vertical radiator for the chosen band, a box with two variable capacitors and 12 radial wires (4 groups of 3 wires each). The radiator is longer than the usual ¼ wavelength for the band. Adjusting the two capacitors while monitoring the SWR with an analyzer brings the SWR to under 1.5.

We decided to use this antenna on 20M CW. The vertical wire was hung from a tree limb and the radials were connected to the box and spread-out on the ground as evenly as possible.

Setup time 15 minutes, teardown even shorter.

So how did it work? We ran 80 watts and essentially worked everyone we could hear. It was definitely a Search and Pounce antenna, not a RUN antenna. The treat for me was working all the audible west coast stations at 10 PM.

This antenna system seems ideal for POTA, because of the easy setup and tuning. The complete kit, as supplied by K7NM, has radiators for 10, 12, 15, 17 and 20M. It all fits in a gallon zip bag.

We will also try to use this on 40M (much longer wires required) and report the results.

AST & Science, LLC has filed for a modification of AST’s current license for five satellites, and seeks authority to operate a constellation of a total of 248 low-earth orbit (LEO) non-geostationary orbit (NGSO) satellites. Among the frequency bands requested in the application (SB Docket 25-201) are the 430-440 MHz band for both Earth-to-Space and Space-To-Earth links. They have also requested authority to use 902-960 MHz.

The Space Bureau has accepted the application for filing for Telemetry, Tracking and Telecommand (TT&C) in the 430-440 MHz band, as well as 2200-2290 MHz (Space-to-Earth) and 45.5 – 47 GHz (Earth-to-Space) bands.

FCC News

American Radio Relay League

Newington, CT, May 23rd, 2025 – ARRL reports that early in the morning, May 22nd, 2025, the US House of Representatives passed a massive Reconciliation bill with the below spectrum provisions relevant to Amateur Radio.

- Within two years not less than 600 megahertz must be identified **from between 1.3 and 10 GHz** for reallocation to commercial use for broadband services.
- The identified spectrum must be auctioned by the FCC for such services on an exclusive, licensed basis as follows: not less than 200 megahertz within three years (mid-2028) and the remaining spectrum (at least 400 megahertz) within six years (mid-2031).
- **Excluded** from spectrum that could be reallocated for these purposes is **3.1 – 3.45 GHz (which includes the temporary secondary Amateur band at 3.300 – 3.450 GHz)** and 5.925 – 7.125 GHz.

With regard to Amateur spectrum, the bands that potentially could be subject to consideration for reallocation under this legislation are 13 cm (2300 – 2310 & 2390 – 2450 MHz) and 5 cm (5650 – 5925 MHz). At this time a number of bands have been mentioned informally for consideration, none of which include Amateur spectrum. But the bands under consideration could change and ARRL will closely monitor the evolving situation.

Additionally, some government operations may be required to consolidate in current Amateur secondary spectrum that is already shared with those government uses. In select instances this might constrain Amateur operations if such consolidation occurs.

It is to be emphasized that these provisions have been passed by the House, but key US Senators have not agreed to some aspects and have stated their intention to modify these provisions as the bill moves through Senate consideration. The stated goal for final enactment is by July 4th, 2025.
